The Department of Health and Human Services' Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) recently launched FindTreatment.gov, a new and improved website for helping to connect Americans throughout the United States who are looking for substance use treatment. Visitors can access information on treatment providers' locations, treatment options, ages treated, and payment and insurance information, and on more than 13,000 state-licensed facilities, based on data compiled by SAMHSA.

[Tribal Behavioral Health Grant Program](#)

SAMHSA is accepting applications for the Tribal Behavioral Health Grant Program (Native Connections). The purpose of this program is to prevent suicide and substance misuse, reduce the impact of trauma, and promote mental health among American Indian/Alaska Native (AI/AN) youth through the age of 24 years. SAMHSA plans to issue 39 grants of up to \$250,000 per year for up to 5 years.

Application deadline: December 10, 2019

[National Child Traumatic Stress Initiative – Category II](#)

SAMHSA is accepting applications for the National Child Traumatic Stress Initiative (NCTSI) - Category II, Treatment and Service Adaptation (TSA) Centers grants. The purpose of the TSA Centers is to provide national expertise for specific types of traumatic events, population groups, and service systems, and support the specialized adaptation of effective evidence-based treatment and service approaches for communities across the nation. SAMHSA plans to issue 7 grants of up to \$600,000 per year for up to 5 years.

Application deadline: December 23, 2019

[National Child Traumatic Stress Initiative – Category III](#)

SAMHSA is accepting applications for the NCTSI - Category III, Community Treatment and Service (CTS) Centers grants. The purpose of this program is to provide and increase access to effective trauma-focused treatment and document services systems in communities for children and adolescents, and their families who experience traumatic events throughout the nation. SAMHSA plans to issue 10 grants of up to \$400,000 per year for up to 5 years.

Application deadline: December 23, 2019

[The Substance Abuse and HIV Prevention Navigator Program for Racial/Ethnic Minorities Ages 13-24](#)

SAMHSA is accepting applications for the Substance Abuse and HIV Prevention Navigator Program for Racial/Ethnic Minorities (Prevention Navigator). The purpose of this program is to provide services to those at highest risk for HIV and substance use disorders (SUDs). SAMHSA plans to issue 82 grants of up to \$200,000 per year for up to 5 years.
